

News & Views

21 hospitals in India selected by ICMR for plasma trials

21 hospitals had been finalized by the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) to initiate clinical trials for convalescent plasma therapy, which uses antibodies from the cured patient's blood, to treat critically ill coronavirus patients. Many of these hospitals chosen are in Maharashtra.

ICMR has selected 5 hospitals in Maharashtra, 4 hospitals in Gujarat, 2 hospitals each in Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Madhya Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh, and one hospital each in Punjab, Karnataka, Telangana and Chandigarh to initiate the clinical trials. The plasma therapy includes drawing out whole blood from a COVID-19 recovered patient and separating the plasma. Around 400 ml plasma is drawn out from one person and can be used to treat two patients.

Out of the 5 hospitals in Maharashtra, 2 are in Pune, 1 in Mumbai, 1 in Nagpur and 1 in Kolhapur. Sir H N Reliance Foundation Hospital and Research Centre of Mumbai are been chosen for these trials. The multi-centre trials are to be conducted on 452 patients across centers.

The project of ICMR's is named as PLACID - 'Phase-II Open Label Randomized Controlled Trial to Assess the Safety and Efficacy of Convalescent Plasma to Limit COVID-19 Associated Complications in Moderate Disease'. The study has already received approval from the COVID-19 National Ethics Committee (CONEC) last week.

On 29th April, the health ministry had labelled as "illegal" of any use of the therapy beyond clinical trials.

Blood thinners may boost survival rates of Covid-infected patients:

As per the Washington report published in the American Journal of Cardiology on May 6th 2020, a study conducted over 2,733 Covid-infected patients says treating these patients with blood thinners may help in boosting their prospects for survival, according to preliminary findings from physicians at New York City's largest hospital system that offers another source of hope in treating the deadly infection.

These observations were based only on a review of medical records and that more rigorous and randomised studies are needed to draw broader conclusions. Since March, when coronavirus hit Europe and the United States, doctors have been reporting mysterious blood clots, which can be gel-like or even semisolid, in a significant subset of coronavirus patients. Autopsies of patients who died of respiratory arrest have shown that some had unusual micro clots in their lungs rather than the typical damage expected.

Last month, doctors reported in the New England Journal of Medicine on five unusual cases of Covid-19 positive people in their 30s and 40s experiencing large strokes. The Mount Sinai study focused on hospitalised patients who were treated from March 14 to April 11. Among the patients, those who were not on ventilators and treated with blood thinners died at similar rates in comparison to those who did not receive blood thinners. But the group of patients who received blood thinners lived longer -- a median of 21 days compared to 14 days, the study said.

For patients on ventilators, the difference was more significant. About 63 per cent of patients who did not receive the medications died compared with 29 per cent who received the treatment. Another critical finding of the study was that giving blood thinners to these patients appeared to be relatively safe. There was not a significant difference in the most dangerous side effect of anticoagulants 'bleeding' in those who were on the drugs and those who were not. A number of medical societies, including the International Society on Thrombosis and Haemostasis and the American Society of Hematology, have put out guidance recommending the use of blood thinners for some Covid-19 patients, but the advice has taken a conservative approach.
